[2SHB 1436](#) **Lobbying report filing** **Moeller**

House General Government Appropriations (originally sponsored by Representatives Moeller and Hunt)

Requires the public disclosure commission to make available to lobbyists, lobbyists' employers, and agencies required to file certain reports, an electronic filing system for submitting the reports over the internet. Requires certain lobbyists, lobbyists' employers, and agencies to: (1) File reports required by chapter 42.17 RCW (disclosure--campaign finances--lobbying) electronically over the internet; and (2) Pay a one-time fee to the public disclosure commission for the development and implementation of the electronic filing system. Creates the lobbying electronic filing account.

[SHB 1992](#) **Construction projects** **Conway**

House Commerce & Labor (originally sponsored by Representatives Conway, Simpson, Wood, Moeller, Williams, Lias, Sullivan, and Chase)

Provides that chapter 39.12 RCW (prevailing wages on public works) applies to construction projects paid for in whole or in part by the equivalent of public funds.

Addresses state revenue related to: (1) Minimum nexus standards; (2) Abusive tax avoidance transactions; (3) Placing a cap on the first mortgage deduction; (4) Direct seller business and occupation tax exemption; (5) Business and occupation tax preferences for manufacturers of products derived from certain agricultural products; (6) Eliminating tax preferences for bullion; (7) Ending the preferential business and occupation tax treatment received by directors of corporations; (8) Airplane excise tax; (9) Public utility tax on interstate hauls; (10) Foreclosure exemption; (11) Tax debts; and (12) Repealing the nonresident sales tax exemption, the sales and use tax exemption for livestock nutrient equipment and facilities, and the business and occupation tax credit for new employment for international service activities.

Initiative measure no. 960

Prentice

Senate Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Senator Prentice)

Revises provisions related to Initiative 960 to provide a means to stabilize revenue collections, by suspending the following requirements until July 1, 2011: (1) A two-thirds vote of each house of the legislature on any action by the legislature that raises state revenue or requires revenue-neutral tax shifts; (2) Notices and cost projections by the office of financial management for bills that raise taxes or increase fees; and (3) A tax advisory vote for a tax increase not referred to the voters.

Large commercial airports

Keiser

Senator Keiser

Requires a local government, in which there is planned to be a primary commercial service airport, to create an aviation protection zone. Requires the aviation division of the department of transportation to hire an independent consultant to identify the location of the next primary commercial service airport. This requirement expires July 1, 2011. Makes an appropriation.

<u>ESSB 6603</u>	General aviation airports	Marr
Senate Transportation (originally sponsored by Senators Marr, Haugen, Swecker, Eide, and Keiser)		
Requires local governments where certain general aviation airports are located to: (1) Evaluate land uses that may be compatible and incompatible with airports and aircraft operations; and (2) Encourage and facilitate the adoption and implementation of comprehensive plan policies and development regulations that restrict the siting of incompatible uses adjacent to such airport. Defines general aviation airport and airport influence area for purposes of the planning enabling act and the growth management act.

Senators Prentice, Murray, Kohl-Welles, Regala, Fairley, Ranker, McDermott, Kline, and Keiser		
Suspends the two-thirds vote requirement of the legislature for tax increases. Provides a means for the legislature to raise new revenue to fund voter-approved initiatives so existing education, public safety, health care, and safety net services for the elderly, disabled, and vulnerable people may be preserved.

Addresses state revenue related to: (1) Minimum nexus standards; (2) Abusive tax transactions; (3) Modifying and placing a cap on the first mortgage deduction; (4) Modifying the nonresident sales tax exemption; (5) Direct seller business and occupation tax exemption; (6) Business and occupation tax preferences for manufacturers of products derived from certain agricultural products; (7) Ending the preferential business and occupation tax treatment received by directors of corporations; (8) Airplane excise tax; (9) Foreclosure exemptions; (10) Corporate officer liability; (11) Rural county tax incentives; (12) Equalizing urban and motor transportation public utility tax rates; (13) Modifying the sales tax exemption for certain fertilizers, sprays, and washes; (14) Deductions, fees, dues, and charges; (15) Limiting the bad debt deduction; (16) Brokered natural gas; (17) Limiting community solar incentives; (18) Livestock nutrients; (19) Bullion; (20) Public utility tax clarification; (21) Eliminating the trade-in allowance; (22) Sales and use tax exemptions for machinery and equipment used in renewable energy generation; (23) Property management salaries; (24) Eliminating the preferential business and occupation tax rate for prescription drug resellers; and (25) Repealing the business and occupation tax credit for new employment for international service activities and the sales tax exemption for coal used at coal-fired thermal electric generation facilities.
