Lobbying report filing

Moeller

House General Government Appropriations (originally sponsored by Representatives Moeller and Hunt)

Requires the public disclosure commission to make available to lobbyists, lobbyists' employers, and agencies required to file certain reports, an electronic filing system for submitting the reports over the internet. Requires certain lobbyists, lobbyists' employers, and agencies to: (1) File reports required by chapter 42.17 RCW (disclosure--campaign finances--lobbying) electronically over the internet; and (2) Pay a one-time fee to the public disclosure commission for the development and implementation of the electronic filing system. Creates the lobbying electronic filing account.

ESSB 6130**Initiative measure no. 960****Prentice**

Senate Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Senator Prentice)

Revises provisions related to Initiative 960 to provide a means to stabilize revenue collections, by suspending the following requirements until July 1, 2011: (1) A two-thirds vote of each house of the legislature on any action by the legislature that raises state revenue or requires revenue-neutral tax shifts; (2) Notices and cost projections by the office of financial management for bills that raise taxes or increase fees; and (3) A tax advisory vote for a tax increase not referred to the voters.

SB 6304**Large commercial airports****Keiser**

Senator Keiser

Requires a local government, in which there is planned to be a primary commercial service airport, to create an aviation protection zone. Requires the aviation division of the department of transportation to hire an independent consultant to identify the location of the next primary commercial service airport. This requirement expires July 1, 2011. Makes an appropriation.

Senate Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Senators Prentice and Tom; by request of Governor Gregoire)
Makes 2010 supplemental operating appropriations.

ESSB 6603**General aviation airports****Marr**

Senate Transportation (originally sponsored by Senators Marr, Haugen, Swecker, Eide, and Keiser)

Requires local governments where certain general aviation airports are located to: (1) Evaluate land uses that may be compatible and incompatible with airports and aircraft operations; and (2) Encourage and facilitate the adoption and implementation of comprehensive plan policies and development regulations that restrict the siting of incompatible uses adjacent to such airport. Defines general aviation airport and airport influence area for purposes of the planning enabling act and the growth management act.

2SSB 6678**Aerospace industry****Hobbs**

Senate Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Senators Hobbs, Kilmer, Marr, Berkey, Tom, and Shin)

Creates the Washington state aerospace training and coordination institute, to the extent that funds are appropriated or other funds are available for this specific purpose, to enhance the vitality of the aerospace industry by coordinating, providing, and developing curricula for a statewide consortium of schools and programs that provide aerospace workforce education and training. Requires the institute to be headquartered in Snohomish county. Creates the center for aerospace technology innovation to lead a collaborative effort between the state's universities, private industry, and government for

the aerospace industry. Requires the center to be headquartered at the University of Washington. Requires the University of Washington, Washington State University, and the department of commerce to work cooperatively with the private sector in the development and implementation of research and new technology. Creates the Washington aerospace futures account.

Provides a means for the legislature to raise new revenue to fund voter-approved initiatives so existing education, public safety, health care, and safety net services for the elderly, disabled, and vulnerable people may be preserved.
